With our November surgery day on Sunday the 18th, Surgery on Sunday wrapped up surgeries for the year since we take a break in December. We also completed our first full year of use of the REDCap referral and record-keeping system. While not everyone gets as excited about databases as I do, this project has helped SOS make great strides in terms of data about our program and easily lets us know information such as:

- surgical patients' ages ranged from 3 to 88 this year
- 18 different surgeons operated with us this year
- 89% of referred patients are uninsured
- more than half of referred patients work at least part-time and 20% are unable to work

Data like this is crucial for grant applications and reports, as well as state and federal reporting. It also helps when recruiting volunteers and donors. Again, I must give credit and a world of thanks to **Kathryn Peterson Dooley** for her many hours of time and her commitment to making REDCap work for us!

November's surgeries included a thyroid lobectomy, a phimosis repair, a laparoscopic cholecystectomy, and a ptosis repair, in addition to six patients who were given the gift of clearer vision through cataract removal. Many thanks to **Dr. David Cowen, Dr. Johannes Evans, Dr. Terrence Grimm, Dr. Paul Kearney**, and **Dr. Greg Osetinsky** for providing these procedures. Thank you as well to **Dr. Anjum Bux** for serving as our supervising anesthesiologist.
